Notes on Clearances

A person registered as a playing member of CAM, Club or Association must obtain a clearance before being eligible to register as a playing member of any other CAM, Club or Association.

A CAM, Club or Association shall not allow a player to practice until the clearance has occurred.

The receiving CAM, Club, Association is required to apply for a clearance or permit online from the player's originating CAM, Club, Association using the Sporting Pulse system. During this time the clearing CAM, Club, Association must act respectfully and professionally towards the player requesting the clearance and not purposefully impede the process

A player cleared from one CAM, Club or Association to another within Tasmania may not be cleared again within six months of the date of the original clearance.

Clearance Process

Clearance request is completed by the player.

CAM, Club, Association administrator will request a clearance. This will be done using Sports TG system.

A request should be granted within seven days of applying. If a CAM, Club or Association do not respond to this request at the end of seven days the requesting person will be cleared.

League/competitions administrators must use the Sports TG advise the status of the request for clearance.

Should a CAM, Club, Association or Professional League Club refuse to grant a clearance upon application as aforesaid, the Applicant shall have the right of appeal against the decision, such appeal being referred to the Board or to a Tribunal specially established by the Board to rule on such matters.
